
those who need it. In addition, they provide clothing, furniture, household items, school supplies, winter jackets & coats.

Men Returning to Revelation



In September, the men's group will again be studying the book of Revelation, this time by reading and discussing "The Revelation of John" by William Barclay.

In this first of two volumes about Revelation, Barclay makes this most difficult book of the Bible easier to understand. "The Revelation of John" Volume 1 examines areas such as the characteristics of apocalyptic literature and the nature of Caesar worship. The Apostle John, the purported author of Revelation, was, as Barclay shows, "soaked and saturated" in the Old

Testament, and most of the imagery he employs is drawn from that source. Barclay clarifies the meaning of this imagery as he introduces the central issues of the book of Revelation. Barclay, a Scottish Presbyterian minister and Professor of Divinity and Biblical Criticism at the University of Glasgow, is well known for his Daily Bible Study series.

These groups will be limited to 10 people each. The cost will be \$20.00, covering materials for each member.

It is CUMC's and Pat's hopes that this new ministry will bring comfort and understanding to those in our community who are in this "land between."

Funded by the Wisconsin United Methodist Foundation, the mission of "In the Land Between" will be to provide support and education to small groups that is sensitive, compassionate, and is a response to the needs of our greater community members who are experiencing grief due to loss and difficult life transitions. General Conference 2019 – Listening Sessions

Why is there a special General Conference coming February 23 – 26, 2019 in St. Louis, only a year before the regularly scheduled 2020 session in Minneapolis? How might my church be affected by this talk about choosing among a One Church, Connectional Conference and Traditionalist plan? Will other possibilities emerge? Change is coming for The United Methodist Church, and there will be meetings this fall to help Wisconsin United Methodists understand what is being proposed.

Formed following authorization by General Conference 2016, the Commission on a Way Forward identified three possible options, or plans, for our denomination as we move into the future. The Council of Bishops has recommended adoption of the One Church Plan.

The Wisconsin Delegation to GC 2019 is hosting eight educational listening sessions around the state to allow feedback about the proposals. These sessions for interested clergy and laity will each last between 60-90 minutes.

Welcome to a new school year! Whether you've been all over the globe this summer, or lounging around town, we want to give you a hearty "Welcome!" as the school year begins again. "Mosaic Youth + Teens" is the name of our Middle and High School ministries here at CUMC. Each year in our ministry is different - different students, different life situations, different perspectives that we gained over the summer. So whether you've been involved in our ministry for years, or whether you're an incoming 6th grader - or, perhaps you've simply never taken the time to see what we're all about - my invitation is to come and be a part of our group as we journey together this year. Our youth ministry is a place where students can bring all of their varying differences and find that even with our differences, we can have a beautiful community centered around Jesus.

Speaking of our differences - this year we are going to focus on the idea; "Be Different." We live in a world that applauds the good looking and seemingly successful individual. We value money, social media fame, and academic success. And while none of these things are inherently bad, it is most of our tendency to let these things run our lives. As we get older and we mature, we often wake up to the fact that these things can't in themselves give us the satisfaction we crave.

So my question to you Middle and High Schoolers (and to those of you who are a bit older too) is - What if life wasn't so much about being just like everyone else, but what if true life was found in being different? What if you could find a love for life that could not be taken from you even if you were to lose your status and money? What if you had a deep joy that wouldn't fade - even if your friends ignored you? What if you could have real peace that couldn't be stolen from you? 

We are hoping that you might want to be in relationship with the various CUMC members who form the core of each of these music ministry efforts. Science has proven that singing and playing together provides us

relief from stress and basic human interaction benefits. Sometimes it seems rather intimidating to try something new so we want to answer a few questions that might be on your minds:

1. Do you need to be a trained professional to participate? No, each group has plenty of room to learn together and we try to focus on praise rather than performance.
2. How long are rehearsals and do I have to be at each one? Generally, one hour and we try to accommodate your personal schedule whenever possible. It is wonderful to have everyone making music present but we know reality doesn't always allow this to happen.
3. What if I haven't played my instrument or sung in a long time? Many of us have experienced a lag in when we participated in group music so dusting off that horn or warming up rusty vocal chords or lifting a handbell comfortably are all part of reshaping each group. We try to find the spot for you where you will feel most comfortable.
4. Can I come and try it out? By all means...show up, listen, join in and then make a decision.
5. What if I need a ride or possible child care? We will try to work with you to help in any way that might make your participation easier.

Each musical group will be set up for visitors to catch the action, experiment with various instruments, experience an "instrumental petting zoo", and see what the fun is all about at CUMC in music ministry. Potential Bonus: We are hoping to combine all of our music ministry teams into a huge jam to finish early in the afternoon.
