Outreach

Golden Cross Sunday — Today, May 19. The Wisconsin Conference of the United Methodist Church is blessed to have numerous committed Health and Welfare Ministries responding in the name of Jesus Christ to persons in need. Those served are of all religions and races, from all parts of the state. They include the homeless, troubled children and families, the unemployed, the hungry, the ill, the disabled and the aged. Let's be generous in our support!

Second Quarter Coin Offering — The second quarter Coin Offering will be going to Northcott Neighborhood House. Each summer, Northcott runs a Day Camp, from the first week in July through the second week in August. Many children attend this fun camp, which costs about \$20.00 per child. Our CUMC coin offerings will help send children to camp.

Every Day Disciple — Are YOU an Every Day Disciple? Please remember that as you perform a service for someone else, you are encouraged to write down your name, what act of discipleship you performed and place the paper in the container in Fellowship Hall. At the end of June, two names will be drawn at the 10:15 service. These two individuals/groups will be able to each choose a charity of their choice, to which \$50 per charity will be donated. If you would like some input on suggested charities, the Outreach Team has a list of these.

Spring Clothing Drive — Drive runs until May 26. Donations will benefit United Methodist Children's Services and Northcott Neighborhood House. Collection will be in the church lobby during the Drive. Please bring new or lightly-used Summer clothing for children, men, and women of all ages.

May Food Drive — The May food collection will serve Family Sharing of Ozaukee County. 44% of the individuals they serve are under the age of 18. 30% of individuals who participate in their program are 65 years of age and older.

Aluminum Can Drive — Start collecting now! Drop off date will be September 28. Our aluminum can drive proceeds will support El Porvenir: Clean Water, Healthy Nicaraguans. 54% of rural Nicaraguans lack access to clean water; 31 % lack adequate sanitation facilities. This project improves the quality of life of rural Nicaraguans through lower incidences of water and sanitation related diseases and mortalities. Wells and latrines are constructed by villagers trained to build the project and carry on its maintenance.
