

Native American Ministries Sunday — April 26th. Did you know? There are 3 Native American UM congregations in Wisconsin. They include Odanah UMC, Odanah (near Ashland), Milwaukee Native American Ministry UMC, and Oneida UMC, DePere. CUMC youth summer work teams served Native American communities in Wisconsin Dells (1978-79), Lac du Flambeau (1980-81), and Odanah UMC (1983-91). These Wisconsin and Native American UM churches and across the country receive support to conduct their ministries from this special offering. Please give generously.
