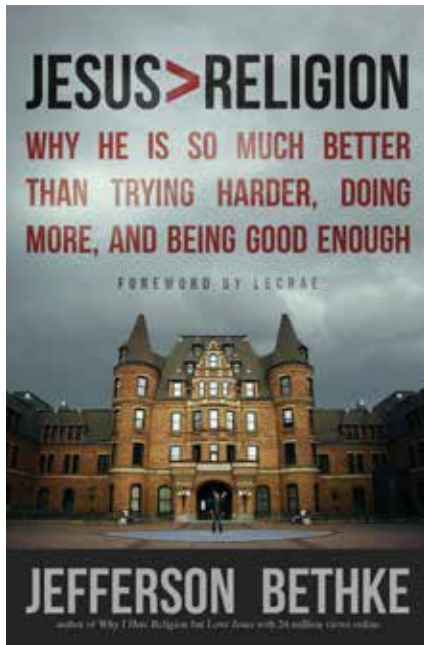

They include Odanah UMC, Odanah (near Ashland), Milwaukee Native American Ministry UMC, and Oneida UMC, DePere. CUMC youth summer work teams served Native American communities in Wisconsin Dells (1978-79), Lac du Flambeau (1980-81), Odanah UMC (1983-91), Oklahoma (2004), South Dakota (2009). These Wisconsin and Native American UM churches and across the country receive support to conduct their ministries from this special offering. Please give generously.

Second Quarter Coin Offering — This week we will look at some of what the Red Bird Mission Outreach Ministries do and continue with that next week. **Community Aid Ministries** includes Emergency Support Services, such as, furniture, clothing, temporary housing/ placement, food assistance, and benefit counseling. **Elderly Ministries** provides elderly and disabled apartments for low-income citizens, a Senior Center, Home Care for the homebound elderly, In-Home Respite Care and Meals on Wheels. **Family Ministries** provides adult education in literacy, computers, job skills and GED preparation. Family Ministries includes transitional housing for families at risk of homelessness receive case management assistance before becoming homeless.

Eyeglasses Needed — A group from St. Paul Lutheran Church in Grafton will be attending a mission trip this summer with MOST Ministries. They will be doing vision screenings and providing eyeglasses to villagers in remote
