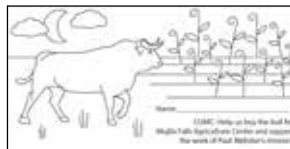
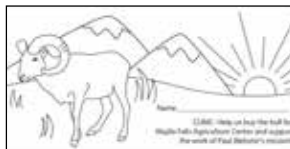
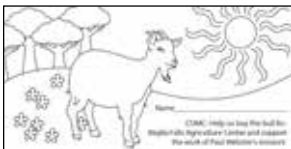


# Buy the Bull!

Replacement of retaining wall around the 1920's Parkview Apts. = \$26,000

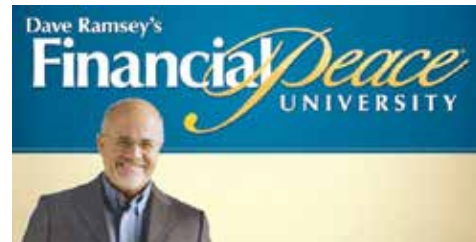
Windows for the apartment building:

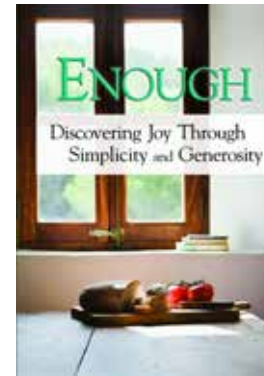
## Save the Date!
