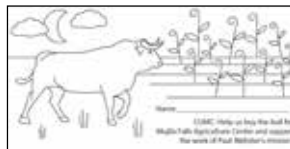
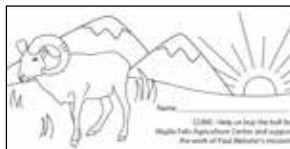
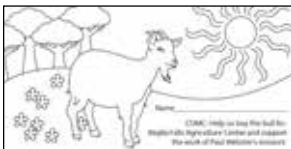


Buy the Bull!

Mujila Falls Mission Outreach Project

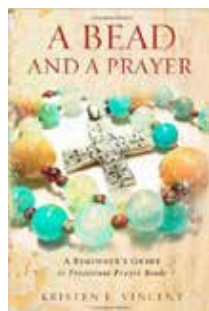

Simple Hope Packathon at CUMC November 7

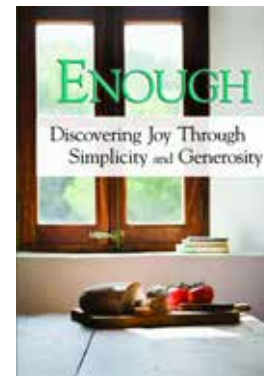
