**Acolyte Training** — Acolyte Training will be held today, October 2, after the 10:15 a.m. service.

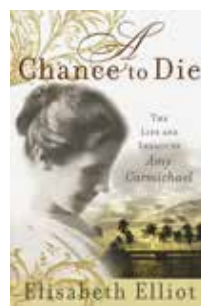
