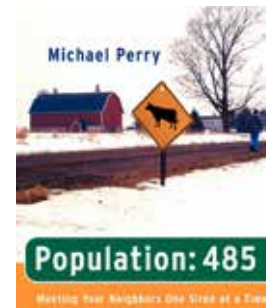

Simple Hope

The manner in which local churches and other organizations support the mission of Simple Hope has changed. Simple Hope will continue their focus on clean water, fruit trees, goats and chickens. But rather than ship food to Tanzania, they will now focus on providing a method by which the people can grow much of their own food. This new method, called SIP'ers, involves growing primarily vegetables in five-gallon buckets. The beauty of this process is that the materials can be bought in Tanzania, avoiding international shipping costs. Saturday, April 29, Simple Hope will hold a "SIP'er" event at CUMC. For \$25, you and your family can come and build a five-gallon SIP'er project that you can take home and use. The \$25 that you pay to participate will go in its entirety to Simple Hope allowing them to purchase the components that the Hadazbe will use in Tanzania to build their own SIP'ers and to grow their own crops. Save the date of Saturday, April 29, for this project. This project will be approximately one hour between 9:00 am and 12:00 pm. Stay tuned for more details.



New Sunday Adult Class - "The Shack"

The Shack is a Christian novel by Canadian author William Young, a former office manager and hotel night clerk.

The title of the book is a metaphor for "the house you build out of your own pain," as Young explained once in a telephone interview. He also told a radio talk show host that "The Shack "is a metaphor for the places you get stuck, you get hurt, you get damaged...the thing where shame or hurt is centered."



The novel follows Mack through an unthinkable painful experience in life, through his encounter with God and God's healing power and grace. In the season of Lent, Pastor Dave believes the very substantial themes having to do with a broken world, evil, suffering and pain - and finding God and His resurrection, life-giving power in the midst of it all is a useful study using this modern story. The assumption is that

you will read along in the book, even if you have read it before, and at some point in Lent go and see the newly released movie.
