Outreach

Second Quarter Mission Coin Offering — This offering will help Midwest Mission Distribution Center in Chatham, IL. MMDC collects and distributes supplies designated for UMCOR relief programs in the US and around the world. January through November, 2017, there were 24 International shipments and 186 National shipments totaling 868,128 pounds of supplies shipped. \$1,192,405 worth of supplies have been sent to survivors of Hurricanes Harvey, Irma, Jose, and Maria since September. Included were 9,288 cleaning buckets, 13,948 personal dignity kits, 5,481 health kits, blankets, hospital supplies, bottled water, and much more. Let's see how "noisy" our coin contributions can be on Sunday morning! Not at church on Sunday? Deposit your coins in the wall box near the food drive baskets. Added Note: Only coins deposited in the collection plate count for mission coin offering. Dollar bills do not. All contributions put in the wall collection box will go to mission coin.
