**Men To Get A Revelation!** — The Thursday morning Men's Study Group will undertake a new book "Letters to the Seven Churches" by William Barclay. This book examines a portion of the book of Revelation. Unfortunately, the book of Revelation has suffered a bad rap. It has either been abandoned as being almost unintelligible or it serves as a crystal ball for eccentrics who claim it portrays things to come. Luther wanted to ban it from the New Testament and others claim that the purported author, John, was mad. Barclay's book examines one section of Revelation concerning the letters to each of the seven churches in Asia. He devotes two chapters to each letter, one chapter characterizes the recipient ancient city and the other comments on John's message to the members of that community. Barclay's presentation is both vivid and relevant and should provide us a background for understanding of the whole of Revelation.
