**Feed The Kids** — CUMC has a great opportunity on Wednesday, August 8, to go to the Salvation Army's Distribution Center at 5880 North 6th Street, Milwaukee (just north of Silver Spring) to make lunches for children. This program runs 5 days a week from 9:00 a.m. to noon during the summer. The lunches are delivered to sites in the city. Over 1000 lunches are made every day. Ten volunteer spots are reserved for us, so sign up early on the sign-up sheet on the kiosk in Fellowship Hall. This is a fun volunteer project! Thank you so much for doing God's work.

Northcott's mission is to support family stability, provide educational and recreational programs for youth, lessen neighborhood tensions, combat community deterioration, and provide various social services for the residents of Harambee and surrounding neighborhoods.
