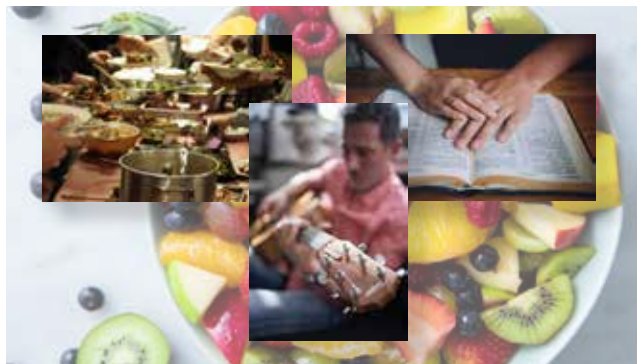


Wednesday Nights in Lent

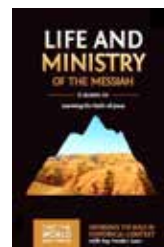
