## Outreach

**Second Quarter Coin Offering** — The second quarter Coin Offering will be going to Northcott Neighborhood House. Each summer, Northcott runs a Day Camp, from the first week in July through the second week in August. Many children attend this fun camp, which costs about \$20.00 per child. Our CUMC coin offerings will help send children to camp.

**Every Day Disciple** — Are YOU an Every Day Disciple? Please remember that as you perform a service for someone else, you are encouraged to write down your name, what act of discipleship you performed and place the paper in the container in Fellowship Hall.
